

*How the students were mentored- the issues addressed, the problems faced by the students.

- The filled up forms of the students were read thoroughly taking into consideration their background, distance of college from their homes, mode of transport, number of members in the families, source of income, salary certificate as submitted along with the filled up application forms, etc.
 - Next consideration being mental and physical health of students.
- Students' regularity in class, 2019-2020 (pre lockdown and post lockdown) their attendance in online classes, interest in studies, performances in Madhyamik and Higher Secondary examinations and CBSC semester results.
- <u>Library</u>: Unavailability of books has been a major concern for some students.
 This issue has been addressed by the teachers providing books from the Departmental Library.
- 4. Economic / financial crisis- many students are from poor economic backgrounds, some avail kanyashree grants an Aid by the State Government for the girl childs' education. Low or meagre income is one of the major hindrances which necessitates half-free and full free reduction in the tuition fees and this has been in practice.
- Addressing students' future in the process of mentoring, thereby encouraging them to pursue higher studies such as Masters. A student with special interest in

fine arts is motivated to take this up and carry forward with vocational training after graduation so that she secures a job to make herself financially stable.

REMARKS

In the process of mentoring, we teachers have come across a few very unfortunate issues related to students, some of them being extremely good in academics and their attendance in class, very regular as well. These cases have been serious and emotionally touching. We have tried to instill hope/faith in them so that they can see a promising future ahead.

Two of the special cases:

- Moumita Das (Roll- 189) 4th Sem- her father is presently unemployed because
 of eyesight problems. He is a farmer, somehow manages a household with
 meagre income. Post-lockdown, life is almost jeopardised. Student herself is
 suffering from spondylosis and eyesight problems.
- <u>Sudipa Das (Roll no- 19292) 2nd Sem</u>- The time she takes to commute from home to college and vice versa is around 5 hours which is a major constraint. Her father is retired. An excellent student with cent percentage attendance in class needs monetary support to continue her studies.
