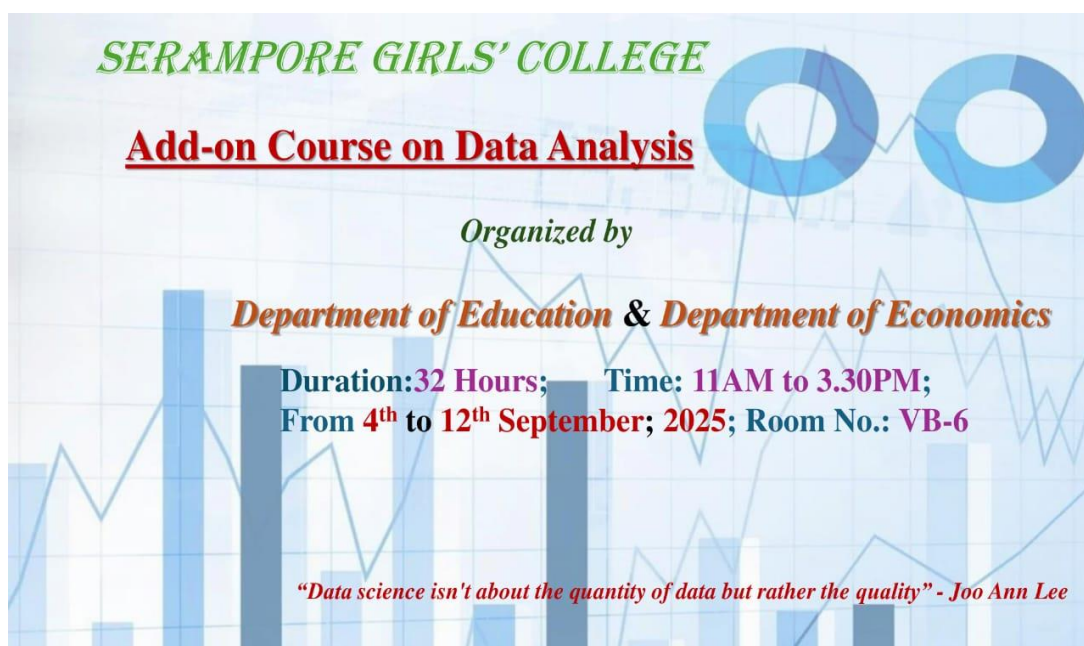

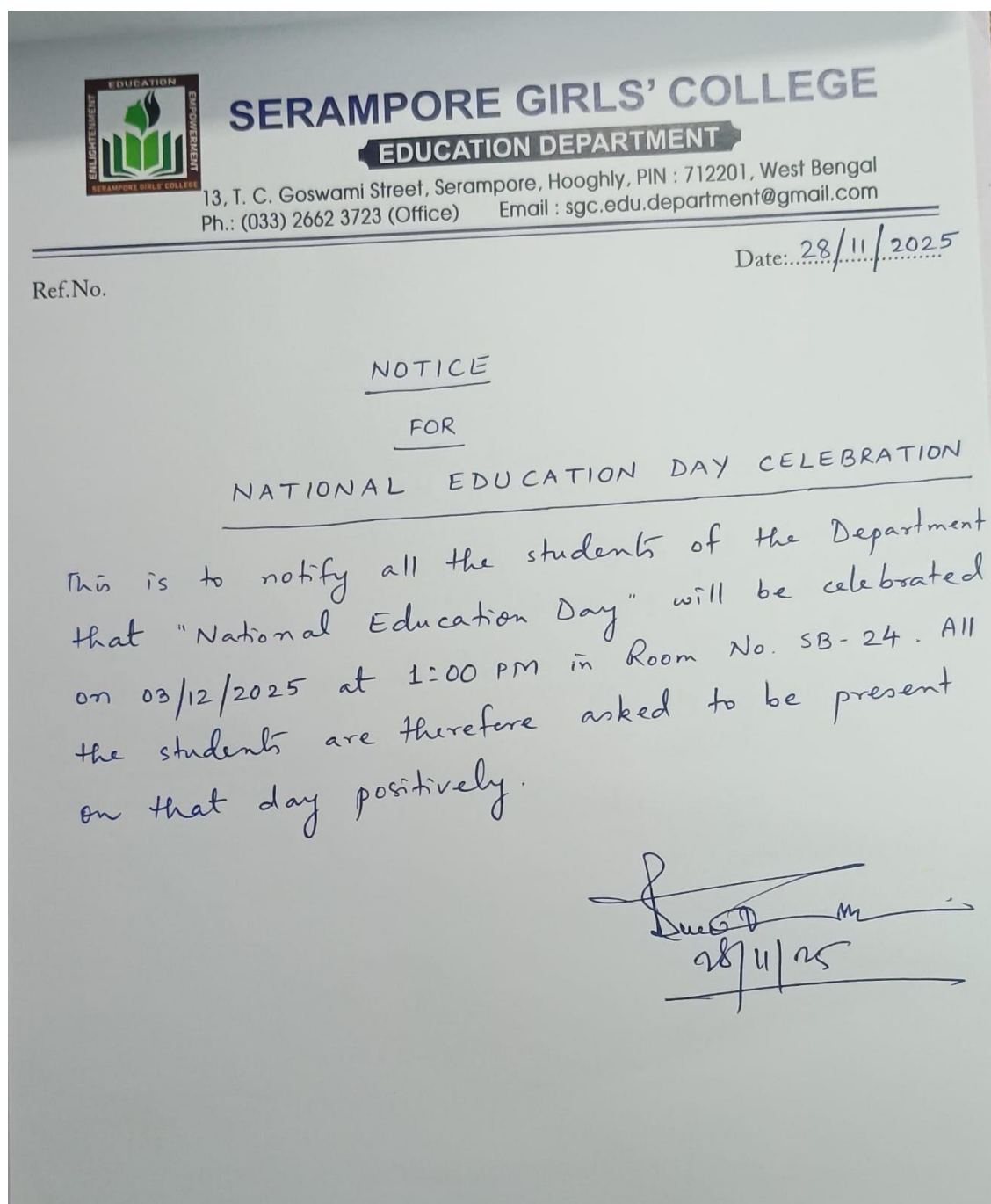
- This add on course, delivered offline mode, aims at providing the student the statistical tools and concepts necessary to make data-driven decisions.

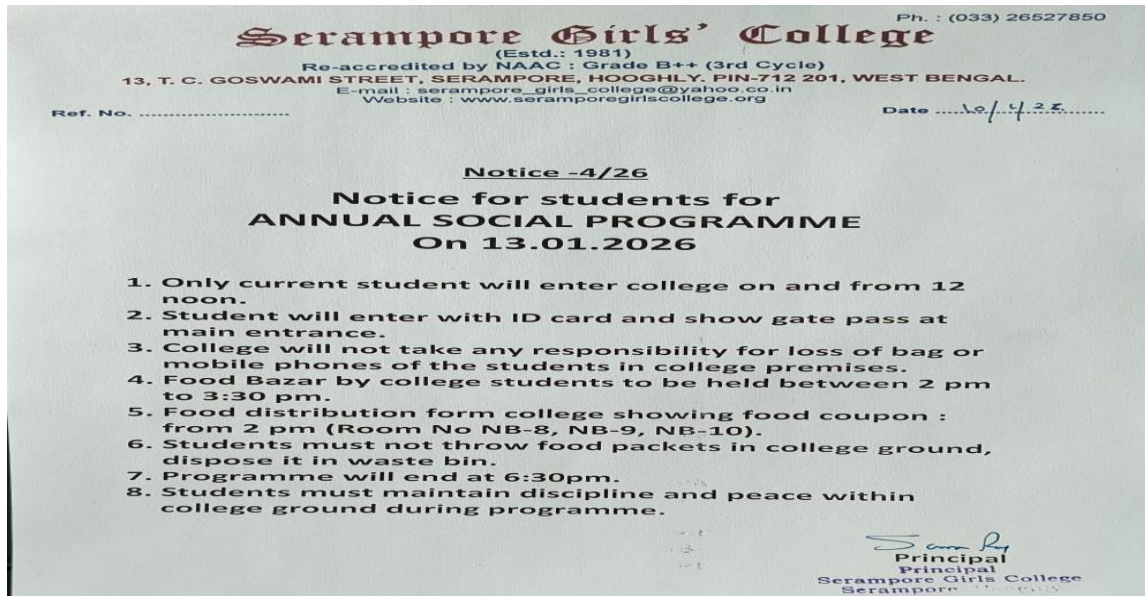
