







Fig. 8: Notice for Teacher's Day Celebration & fresher's Welcome Programme



- xiii) Project Papers and Term Papers are intended to give the students first-hand knowledge about the subject.
- xiv) Knowledge of research methodologies motivated the students for advanced educational research work when they go for next level of higher education.
- xv) The syllabus of B.A Education Honours equips the student for competitive exams like, UPSC, WBPSC, Teacher Eligibility Test (TET), PSC, SSC, RAIL, WBCS, WBLS, P.O., I.A.S., etc. and enhances employability.
- xvi) This syllabus also motivated the students for professional courses like, D.L.Ed., B.Ed., M.B.A., L.L.B., B.L.I.S., Computer, Guidance & Counselling, Fashion Design, Inclusive Education courses etc.
