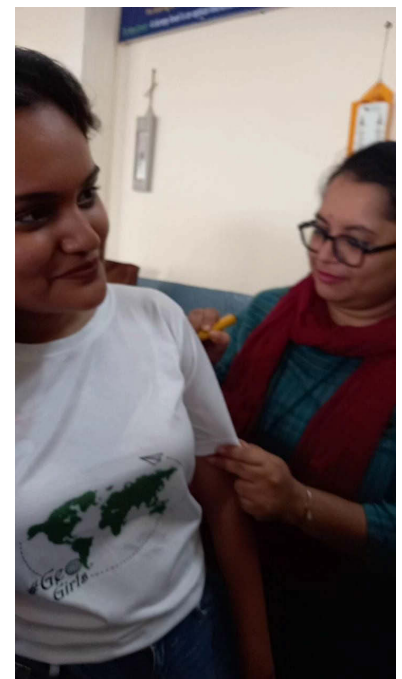
## CELEBRATION OF FAREWELL PROGRAMME
