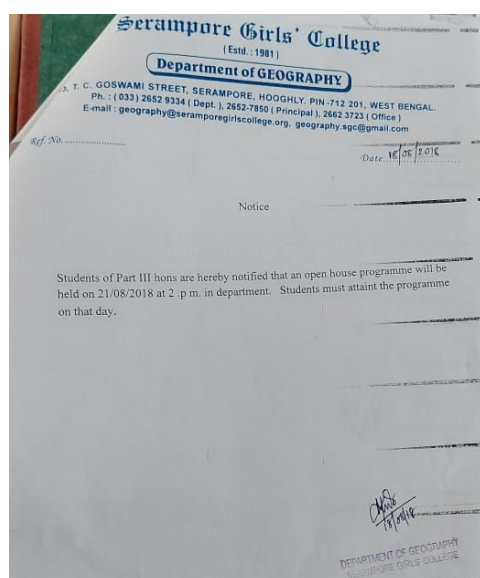
5.OPEN HOUSE PROGRAMME

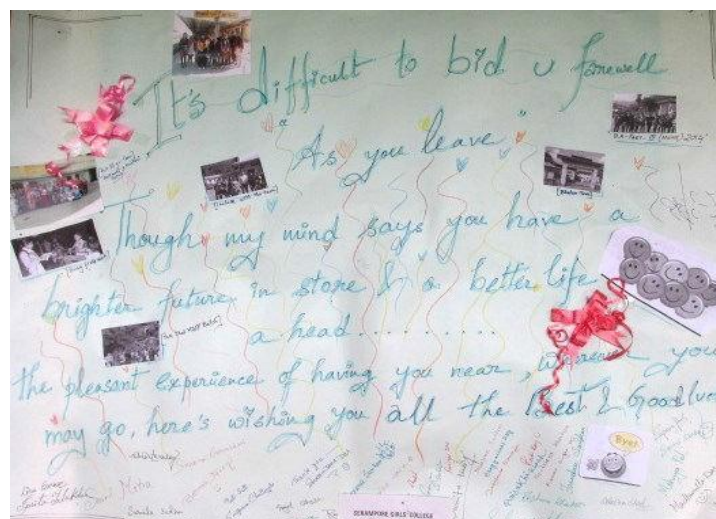


STUDENTS FAREWELL PROGRAMME
