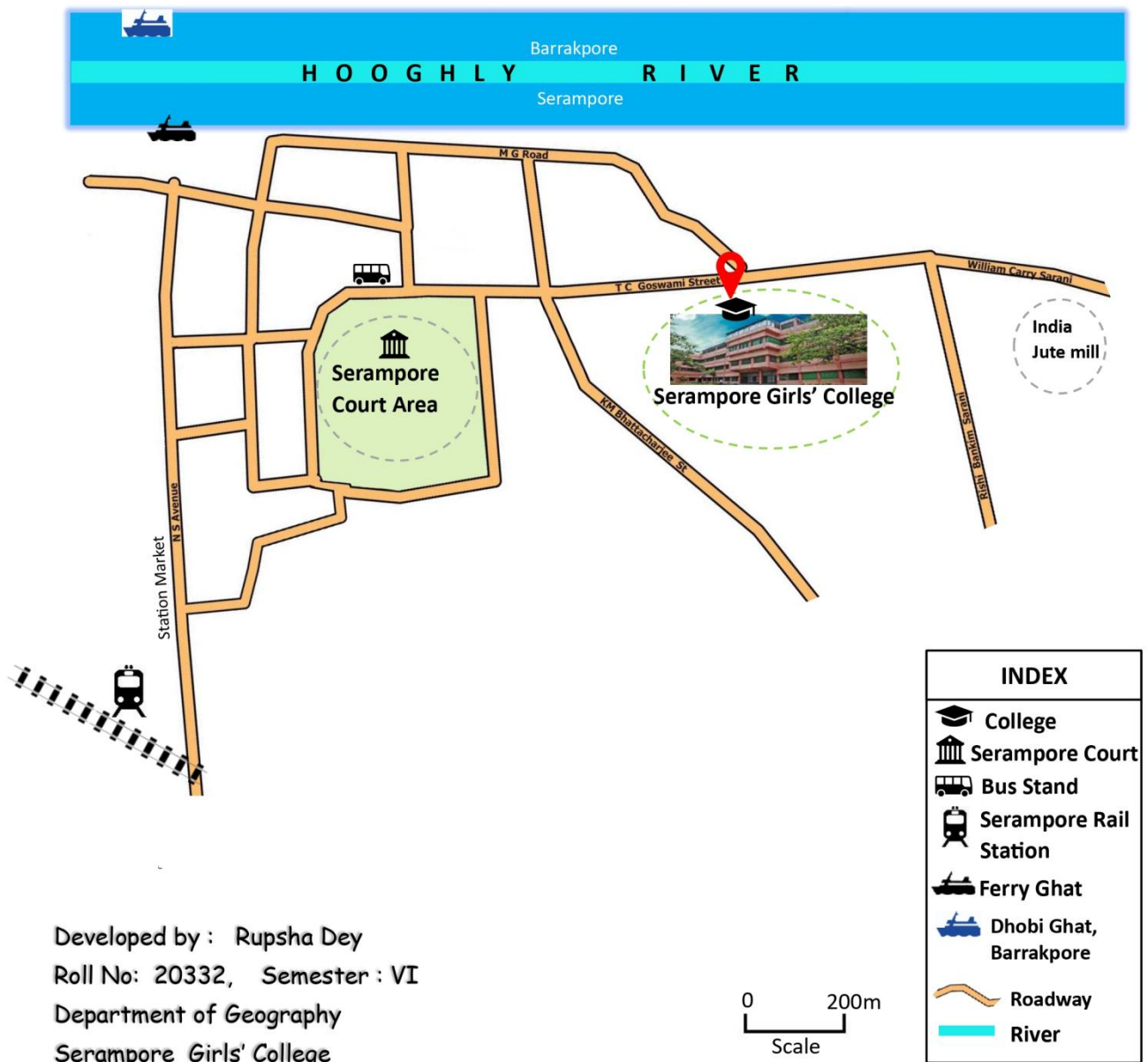
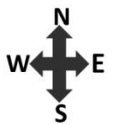
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ROUTE MAP

Serampore Girls' College was founded on June 6, 1981 to cater to the local demand for a Girls College. Late Sm. Anila Devi, the noted educationist and the then President of West Bengal Higher Secondary Council inaugurated the college in the presence of Late Prof Sambhu Ghosh, the then Minister for Higher Education, Late Bhabani Mukhopadhyay, former Minister for Parliamentary Affairs Govt of West Bengal Late Kamal Krishna Bhattacharya, the then MLA and Chairman of Serampore Municipality and other dignitaries

Affiliated to the University of Calcutta and recognized by the Govt of West Bengal and University Grants Commission, New Delhi, the college sent its first batch of students in

Humanities Group for the Graduation Examination in 1983 Since the date of its foundation the college has marched forward heedlessly to fulfil its twin goal of promoting female education in this part of the suburb and shaping its students into citizens of high calibre and character through various academic literary and cultural activities. periodically organized therein.

Starting from a scratch the college has grown into a very prominent educational institution with its affiliation in degree Arts and Science At present the college has about two thousand students on its roll it has achieved permanent affiliation to the University of Calcutta in 1981 and at present it has affiliation at the degree level in Nine Honours and Eighteen General subjects The smooth running of these departments is ensured by an efficient set of dedicated and highly qualified teachers. The college has also a well-stocked library, a reading room, well-equipped laboratories in Laboratory based Subjects, and computers for various departments including Education and Sociology.

The students are also provided with excellent Library facility which is run by: qualified and efficient Librarian and other Reading Room Advisors. The College has a thoroughly computerized office with an efficient set of non-teaching staff. The students have an easy access to the Students' Common Room, Canteen and Games Room. The college has an active Grievance Redressal Cell where the In-charge of the Cell meets the students at appointed time.

The college with its attractive building on large premises, is situated in between Serampore Court and Walsh Hospital. Its close proximity to Railway station and Bus stand ensures its easy accessibility during its journey the college has received several grants and donations from various Govt and Private Sectors. Apart from the State Government and University Grants Commission, several noted persons have extended their helping hands for the overall development of the college Initially the college was established in an ancient rented house, later State Govt handed over a wasteland to college on 1994. Main academic building of the college was raised on this land.

In 2016, the college has been re-accredited by NAAC with a decent B Grade (2nd cycle) College has received a State Government fund of Rupees One Crore and Nine Lakhs for Construction of a new building on 2014. A new four-storied building has been constructed with financial assistance of State Govt and college fund.

Our government also believes that the holistic development of a country must require women's empowerment and for that government has taken different policies to incentivise women in pursuing higher education. 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IMPORTANT INFORMATION TO THE STUDENTS

College Hours: Normally all classes are held from 9.45 AM to 5.00 PM on Monday to Saturday College hours may alter from time to time to suit the convenience of the staff and the students or to satisfy the requirements of Calcutta University.

Payment of Fees:

Tuition fees are to be paid from 1st day to 10th of the month in the college cash counter failing of which a fine at the rate of Rs. 10/- per month will be charged. A student who defaults in paying her fees for two consecutive months remains no longer a student of the college and her name will be struck off from the students' register. A defaulter may be readmitted only on payment of re admission fees and other dues on the discretion of the Principal A Fee-book is supplied to each student either on admission or on promotion to the higher class. All fees must be paid through this Fee-book. For loss of the Fee-book, Identity Card etc. fine of Rs. 30/- will be charged. Students must carefully preserve their Fee Books and Identity Card as they will have to produce the same whenever required.

Migration:

A student coming from any Board, Council or University other than W.B. of Higher Secondary Education may be provisionally admitted to the 1st year Degree class subject to the condition that she shall produce her original Migration Certificate within a month from the date of her admission.

Enrolment of unsuccessful candidates:

Unsuccessful candidates of the B.A/B.Sc/ B.Com examination who are eligible as per Calcutta University rules, to appear at the same or compartmental examination next year must register their names by filling up casual admission form on payment of requisite fees. They are required to fill up in Examination Form and deposit fees on scheduled dates as notified by the college authority Unsuccessful students In Test Examinations will not be allowed to fill up the forms for the Final Examination.

Percentage of Attendance: As per rules of the University, a student must attend 75% of the lectures delivered. A student who attended less than 75% but not less than 60% of the

lectures delivered may be sent up as a non-collegiate student on payment of a non-collegiate fee of Rs 100/- as prescribed under the rules. A student who attended less than 60% of lectures delivered should be treated as a dis-collegiate student and forfeit the rights to appear at the Final Examination.

RULES OF CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE

Students should obey the following Rules and Disciplines of the college:

1. Students are expected to treat the staff members of the college and fellow students with courtesy both inside and outside the college.
2. Use of Cell Phones in the class, corridors, office, Principal's Chamber is strictly prohibited.
3. Students must not enter or leave a class without the permission of the teacher in the class.
4. Loitering in the corridors is strictly prohibited.
5. Indecent dresses and unusual hair style are forbidden.
6. Perfect silence is to be maintained in the Library Reading Room.
7. Talking and whispering in the class room is strictly forbidden when the lecture is being Delivered.
8. Habits of cleanliness are essential.
9. Slogan shouting in the corridor is totally forbidden.
10. Students should stay inside the college campus during leisure periods and they are advised to utilize the time in Library Reading Room or in the Common Room Disciplinary actions may be taken against the students who will be absent in the Departmental Quiz, Seminars and Tutorials.
11. Students must not adopt unfair means in the examinations. Students found guilty of such offences will be severely dealt with which may result even to the extent of expulsion from the College.
12. Impersonation at the time of Roll Call is a serious offence Disorderly conduct in any part within the College premises is strictly forbidden. Every class will be collectively responsible for the conduct of its members.
13. Students must not enter the office, Principal's Room, Professors' Room except on genuine business and that too with due permission.

14. No meeting or conference in the name of the College or any organization can be held within the College premises without prior permission from the Principal/Teacher-in-charge.

15. Names of the students are struck off from the College Register on the following grounds (a) gross misconduct, (b) irregular/unsatisfactory attendance, (c) failure to appear in the Examination, (d) adoption of unfair means in examination, (e) Non-payment of tuition fees consecutively for more than two months and/or College dues by specified due dates, (f) Non return of library books within due date, (g) unsatisfactory progress and (h) violation of college code of conduct and discipline.

16. Detention Charge for Certificates / Diplomas etc. per year Rs. 10/.

17. Violation of the rules and discipline may cause cancellation of admission in the college.

Concession in Tuition Fees:

Concessions in tuition fees are granted to the poor students with good academia and attendance record as per Government rules and regulations. Government Scholarship and stipend are also offered to the SC, ST, OBC and Physically handicapped students of the college. The Concession may be discontinued if the students conduct of attendance & academic performance are not satisfactory. Special Financial help from Poor Fund maintained by the TS and NTS studying College-financing subjects.

Identity Card:

Students must carry on their neck Photo identity Cards issued by the College during the college hours for security purposes and the I Card must be presented at any time if asked to do so by any teaching or non-teaching staff of the College. If the Card is lost the principal must be informed immediately with intimation to the concerned Police Station and a new ID. Card may be issued on payment of requisite fee.

Educational Excursion:

Educational tour/excursion is conducted every year by the department of Geography and other departments. Tour in the Dept of Geography is compulsory.



College Canteen:

Our canteen located on the ground floor of the college just on the left side of the college entrance. Here healthy tiffin and tea are served to all at subsidized rates during the academic

session, except on the days of university examination and holidays. At a time, total thirty seating arrangements are available for students and staffs.

The College Grievance Redressal Cell and Anti-ragging Committee:

LIBRARY RULES

1. Library cards are issued twice a year in June/July (Admission time) & November. It is compulsory for everyone to have their library cards.
2. On payment of the Library deposit each student is provided with two cards, one Reference Card and the other Lending/ Borrower's Card. The cards are strictly Non-transferable. Reference Card is meant for the issue of a book to be read. only on the day, in the Reading Room, books will be issued for maximum 15 days against Lending/Borrower's Card for home issue.
3. Students can borrow one book at a time, which is to be returned within 15 days from the date of issue. No renewal will be allowed.
4. Students will be issued books only one in a day against Borrower's Card. Return of the same will be allowed after the lapse of a full-day.
5. A fine of Re. 1/- per day must be paid for every books returned late. No fine will be charged for books overdue if a letter can be produced showing that the borrower has been absent for valid reasons.
6. Library Cards are to be kept with utmost care, loss of which must be reported immediately to the librarian and a duplicate card will be issued on payment of fine Rs. 50/-(fifty only).
7. Books are also issued during Puja and Winter vacations, but each and every student must have library clearance before they fill their forms for the final examination.
8. Any book lost, damaged or defaced must be replaced by the borrower. If the book be one of a series and is not available single, the whole set must be replaced. Should the book be lost, be out of print, the borrower must pay a fine to be decided by the principal, in addition to the published price. Till the damage or loss is made good the borrower will have no right to use the library.
9. Library Card should be shown during Library clearance.
10. The library will provide photocopying facility for the students after 3 pm (except Saturday) at a reasonable rate.
