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#### Bengali (General)

#### **Course Outcome**

#### B.A. in Bengali

#### **Programme Outcome**

- i) Through the theoretical studies, the Bengali speaking students can get a clean concept of the origin of their vernacular, its use and present status.
- ii) It gives an overall concept of the literary creations of the Bengali poets and literatures and several Bengali literary genres, such as poetry, short story, novel, drama, essay etc. students also develop a good taste for literature.
- iii) The students can learn the procedures and ways of reading poetry, novel, essay, drama etc., through an intensive. Study which improves their skill of enjoying the literary flavour.
