Philosophy encompasses a wide range of inquiries into fundamental questions about

existence, knowledge, values, reason, mind, and language. It examines the nature of reality, morality, and the human experience, offering frameworks for critical thinking and ethical deliberation. Philosophy is relevant as it provides frameworks for critical thinking, ethical deliberation, and understanding the world. It informs various disciplines, including science, politics, and art, by addressing fundamental questions about truth, meaning, and the nature of reality.
